1000s of nuclear bombs? Russia exits US nuke pact to reclaim 34 tons of plutonium. Russia has officially pulled out of an important agreement with the United States regarding how to dispose of weapons-grade plutonium. According to Russia's state news agency TASS, the lower house of the Parliament passed legislation on October 8 to officially denounce the 2000 Plutonium Management and Disposition Agreement (PMDA). The pact required both nations to dispose of 34 metric tons of weapons-grade plutonium, enough for thousands of nuclear warheads, by converting it into fuel for civilian power reactors. Threats by **Iranian** hardliners to leave the Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) after a June war are likely headed nowhere because of Tehran's keenness not to irritate Russia and China, Middle East expert Kenneth Pollack told Iran International. "The Chinese absolutely do not want to see Iran acquire nuclear weapons. That would be very problematic for them. For the same reason, the Chinese do not want to see Iran violate the NPT," added Pollack, Vice President for Policy at the Middle East Institute think tank in Washington DC. North Korea is believed to have accumulated large quantities of weapons-grade uranium. according to South Korea. Seoul's Unification Minister Chung Dong-young cited an assessment that Pyongyang possesses 2,000kg of highly enriched uranium "at a purity of 90 percent or higher". If confirmed, the amount would also signal a sharp increase in North Korea's stockpile of nuclear material. Intelligence provided by civilian experts reveals that North Korea is operating four enrichment plants, he added. Aljazeera 25th Sept 2025

Russia has agreed to build nuclear power sites in Iran at a meeting in Moscow between Vladimir Putin and Tehran's atomic energy chief. Mohammad Eslami said during a visit to Moscow that the two countries would sign a deal on expanding Iran's nuclear power capacity this week. The agreement, reached three months after Iran's nuclear enrichment sites were bombed during the 12-day war. came as dozens of Iranian MPs separately called for the development of atomic weapons. An international deal with Iran designed to keep the world safe from the spread of atomic weapons has officially ended, with Tehran announcing the termination of the decade-old agreement. Iran said on Saturday that it was no longer bound by the 2015 agreement, officially known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), under which international sanctions were lifted in exchange for limitations on Tehran's nuclear programme. From now on "all of the provisions [of the 2015] deal], including the restrictions on the Iranian nuclear programme and the related mechanisms are considered terminated", Iran's foreign ministry said in a statement. A Russian submarine capable of carrying nuclear missiles has declared an 'explosion hazard' alert after suffering a fuel leak in the Mediterranean. The Black Sea Fleet submarine Novorossiysk is 'experiencing serious technical problems' and has now put out the urgent warning, Russian Telegram channel VChK-OGPU reported today. The crew of the 242ft Kilo-class craft may have no choice but to pump out the hold directly into the sea, it was alleged by the channel's source.

A protest was organised outside the University of Sheffield's Advanced Manufacturing Research Centre (AMRC). ... The AMRC is working with the Atomic Weapons Establishment (AWE) to design the Astraea, a new generation nuclear warhead. This research has been taking place for at least the past three years. The weapon being designed with AWE is expected to be 30 times as powerful as the bomb that was dropped on Hiroshima. The Royal Navy's newest nuclear-powered attack submarine, HMS Agamemnon, has successfully submerged for the first time during trials at BAE Systems' Barrow-in-Furness shipyard, according to the company. The three-day "trim dive" in Devonshire Dock tested the 7,400-tonne vessel's stability, buoyancy, and watertight integrity ahead of its departure from Barrow to join the Royal Navy's fleet at His Majesty's Naval Base Clyde. Glasgow will play a central role in building a new generation of attack submarines after UK ministers stepped in to save a facility at risk of collapse due to an SNP "student politics" ban on munitions funding. John Healey, the defence secretary, is expected to confirm in his speech to Labour conference on Monday that plans for a state-of-the-art welding centre, which the SNP guango Scottish Enterprise refused to support due to its potential military uses, will go ahead after he agreed to provide the funding instead. ... Ambitious plans for the new centre, backed by Strathclyde University and a £11 million investment from Rolls-Royce, were days from collapse after the agency made clear it would not provide an anticipated £2.5 million in funding as it deemed submarines a "weapon". The revelation led to

months of criticism that an SNP ban on taxpayer support for munitions projects meant Scotland was at risk of missing out on a boom in defence funding, while undermining the defence of Britain and its allies.

The UK's nuclear deterrent programme reached another milestone on Monday as steel was cut for HMS King George VI, the fourth and final Dreadnought-class submarine. The ceremony at BAE Systems in Barrow-in-Furness was led by Defence Secretary John Healey MP, marking the start of construction on a vessel expected to enter service in the early 2030s as part of the UK's continuous atsea deterrent. "Submarine building is a vital UK industry, sustaining thousands of jobs and apprenticeships up and down the country, all while continuing to keep the country safe around the clock," said Healey. ... The event coincided with the commissioning of HMS Agamemnon, the Royal Navy's newest Astuteclass attack submarine, by King Charles III. The King also formally conferred the title of Royal Port on Barrow, recognising the town's role as the hub of UK submarine construction.
