BITS FROM ABROAD

As anti-nuclear activists prepared to mark the UN International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons (on Monday 26 September), the Nuclear Free Local Authorities were delighted to hear that in New York seven nations had signed or ratified a ground-breaking treaty to make the world nuclear weapon free. In defiance of the pervading pessimism generated by the failure of the Non-Proliferation Treaty review conference in New York, the recent nuclear threats by President Putin, and the minute hand of the Doomsday Clock pointing almost at midnight, the 'Magnificent Seven', as NFLA Chair Councillor David Blackburn has called them, purposefully chose to make a pledge to peace by meeting at the United Nations headquarters to affirm their support for the UN **Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear** Weapons (the Ban Treaty). Staff maintaining the UK's nuclear weapons are to vote on **strike action** as firefighters who claim they are using food banks because of the cost of living crisis are set to reject a pay offer. Prospect, the union, said it would ballot members working at the Atomic Weapons Establishment (AWE) in a dispute over pay. AWE, based in Aldermaston, Berkshire, supports and maintains Trident, the UK's nuclear programme which is based at HMNB Clyde in Faslane, Argyll and Bute. The union said the atomic weapons company recently became "an arm's-length body" of the Ministry of Defence with the associated freedoms on pay awards, but had offered a rise of 5 per cent, which members rejected. An additional lump sum payment averaging £780 has also been offered.

NUCLEAR POWER

The UK's next proposed nuclear plant has received the joint backing of both (former) Prime Minister Liz Truss and French President Emmanuel Macron. The two leaders issued a joint statement in which they said they were keen to advance cooperation, on energy in particular. This included a pledge of "full support" for Sizewell C on Suffolk's coast, which will be developed by French energy company EDF.

Workers at Dounreay in Scotland, UK, have carried out the first in a series of campaigns to seal waste containers into place within the two near-surface low-level waste (LLW) disposal vaults at the site.

New YouGov tracker data reveals that Britons are increasingly supportive of nuclear energy, even though perceptions of its safety remain unchanged. From late 2019 to summer 2021, Britons were divided on using nuclear power. Around four in ten over that time period supported doing so, while a similar number opposed it. Since then, support has been on the rise. Almost half (48%) of Britons now back the use of nuclear energy, compared to 31% who are opposed.
