The dangers of nuclear war – CND national chair addresses meeting in Birmingham

Tom Unterrainer, Chair of national CND, spoke at the joint WMCND/Stop The War meeting on 29th March.

Tom spoke about the dangers of nuclear war and suggested that, because of the ongoing situation in Ukraine, people are more alert to the danger of nuclear war than has been the case for many years. As we know, the use of nuclear weapons would lead to the extermination of life on the planet. By threating to use nuclear weapons and placing the nuclear system on high alert, Putin has shattered the taboo.

CND opposes Russia's actions in Ukraine. A military victory is unthinkable and would lead to tens of thousands of deaths and swathes of destruction. CND stands with anti-war movement in Russia. Ukraine is being turned into rubble, Russia is being turned into a prison. CND delivered letter to Russian ambassador in London arguing for the rights of protestors.

NATO is a nuclear-armed alliance which gives its members access to nuclear weaponry. After World War II, this so-called "defensive alliance" was (according to Lord Ismay, its first General Secretary) created to "keep the Soviet Union out, the Americans in, the Germans down". Keeping Americans in Europe was a priority and one of the main functions of NATO was to maintain US influence in Europe under the nuclear umbrella.

After 1990 many people wondered if there would be be a genuine rethinking of security, a real peace dividend? The calls from the peace movement were ignored: NATO expanded, nuclear stockpiles grew. The 1999 aerial bombardment of Yugoslavia was launched by NATO alone without reference to the UN. NATO bombarded Yugoslavia, a country which was not threatening a NATO member state.

This is important to remember; when politicians appeal to "rules-based" approach, they are in fact appealing for the right to break the rules. We are supposed to believe that the USA is the ultimate guarantor of rules-based order – yet we see that the rules are broken regularly without embarrassment. Economic and military considerations routinely usurp the place of legality. As well as expanding geographically, NATO also expanded its field of operations and so-called "sphere of influence" while at the same time continuing to develop nuclear capabilities.

Tom was clear that we need to oppose this war and prevent escalation to use of nuclear weapons. CND's mission is to oppose all nuclear weapons in every country, but at the moment the urgent threat is linked to the ongoing war in Ukraine.

The US Department of Defense has added the UK to a list of NATO nuclear weapons storage locations in Europe being upgraded under a multi-mllion dollar infrastructure programme.

The return of US nuclear weapons to Britain – along with the upgrading of its nuclear weapons across Europe – constitutes a further undermining of prospects for global peace. The US is the only country to locate its nuclear weapons outside its own borders and this major increase in NATO's capacity to wage nuclear war in Europe is dangerously destabilising. Their return will increase global tensions and put Britain on the front line in a NATO/Russia war.

ANTI-NUCLEAR campaigners have won a victory for free expression after forcing Transport for London (TfL) to back down from refusing to consider a peace advert on the network. TfL initially refused an application from CND for advertising space across the capital but has been forced to reconsider following a threat of legal action by the Public Interest Law Centre. The application, originally submitted in 2021, asks: "Why are we getting more nuclear weapons when we could be investing in healthcare. renewable energy, education?" Andy Burnham has called for Britain to hold a fresh debate on worldwide nuclear disarmament in the wake of Russia's invasion of Ukraine. It comes as the US rejects Zelensky's call for a no-fly zone, as well as a suggestion of giving Polish fighter jets to tackle Russian bombing raids, for fear it would escalate the conflict. The Mayor of Greater Manchester's words marked a split with the official Labour line of support for the UK's nuclear deterrent of Trident missiles, kept continuously at sea in Vanguard submarines.

TRIDENT AND RELATED NEWS

An unmarked military convoy carrying 'up to six' nuclear warheads passed through Glasgow in mid-March amid heightened tensions over Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Nukewatch UK tracks and monitors the convoys that transport the UK's Trident nuclear warheads by road from Atomic Weapons Establishment Burghfield near Reading to Coulport. On the northern shore of Gare Loch. washed by salt waters that merge into the Firth of Clyde, is the naval base, Faslane, home to Vanguard-class submarines. The UK has four such Trident-carrying submarines, each armed with eight missiles, each of which carries three warheads. All together, currently, the UK holds a stockpile of 225 such warheads. This sea loch, and the wildlife it sustains, knows little of the destructive capacity contained within it. Each warhead is said to be eight times as destructive as the bomb dropped on Hiroshima in 1945, which killed over 140,000 civilians. They are dark pearls of latent horror; symbols of humanity's power and folly. https://bit.ly/3rXBC6b

NUCLEAR POWER

The energy crisis gripping Britain following the Russian invasion of Ukraine could see the UK Government move rapidly to get Wylfa B back on track. Energy prices were already spiralling in Europe and have now been further exacerbated by the war and moves to cut reliance on Russian oil and gas. This crisis has highlighted the risk of relying heavily on imports to power the country and increased the urgency to move to additional renewables and low carbon alternatives like nuclear. Rolls-Royce is appealing to the UK government to speed up the rollout of small modular reactors (SMRs) with Wylfa on Anglesey and Trawsfynydd in Gwynedd prime potential sites.
