Iran has begun construction on a new nuclear power plant in the country's southwest, Iranian state TV announced, amid tensions with the U.S. over sweeping sanctions imposed after Washington pulled out of the Islamic Republic's nuclear deal with world powers. ... Iran has one nuclear power plant at its southern port of Bushehr that went online in 2011 with help from Russia, but also several underground nuclear facilities. The announcement of Karoon's construction came less than two weeks after Iran said it had begun producing enriched uranium at 60% purity at the country's underground Fordo nuclear facility.

Workers at hazardous nuclear waste site test positive for drugs. Random testing has been carried out on 741 workers over the past year. Seven workers at the hazardous Sellafield nuclear waste site have tested positive for drugs over the past twelve months. Three have tested positive for alcohol, raising questions over safety at the site. ... The figures were released to The Telegraph following a Freedom of Information request. It did not reveal what action had been taken against those who tested positive. Sellafield is considered one of the most hazardous nuclear sites in the world, according to the Office for Nuclear Regulation, handling more radioactive material per square meter than any site in Europe.

TRIDENT AND RELATED NEWS

New evidence that Trident submarines have been at sea for a record-breaking five months in 2022 has prompted a former submarine commander to warn of risks to nuclear safety. Observations at the Faslane nuclear submarine base on the Clyde suggest that two submarines armed with Trident missiles each went out on patrol for 157 days, one from January to June and the other from May to November. That's longer than submarines are previously known to have been at sea. Rob Forsyth, commanded nuclear submarines with the Royall Navy in the 1970s, said that the strains of such prolonged voyages caused "operating errors", "a breakdown in morale" and posed "a direct threat to nuclear safety." The Nuclear Free Local Authorities have welcomed the Prime Minister's recent decision to award a medal to Britain's nuclear test veterans but recognise that their fight for justice goes on. Prime Minister Rishi Sunak announced at a special ceremony held at the National Memorial Arboretum in Staffordshire last Monday that a new Nuclear Test Medal will be awarded to nuclear test veterans. The ceremony was attended by veterans and their families and by Defence Secretary Ben Wallace and Veterans' Affairs Minister Johnny Mercer.

NUCLEAR POWER

The Nuclear Free Local Authorities have sent a second letter to each of the four Community Partnerships responsible for taking forward proposals for a nuclear waste dump to seek assurances that opponents of the plan should have a chance to take up membership. The Community Partnerships in West Cumbria and East Lincolnshire are each pursuing the possibility of hosting Britain's many tons of high-level radioactive waste, produced from Britain's civil nuclear and military nuclear programmes, in an undersea Geological Disposal Facility.

The Government confirmed that £700million of public money will be invested power plant..... Taxpayers will hand China millions of pounds to quit its nuclear power venture in Suffolk as part of a £700m deal as the "golden era" of UK-China relations comes to an end. The Government is spending an initial £679m to help get the £20bn Sizewell C nuclear power plant project off the ground and has confirmed part of this will go to state-owned China General Nuclear (CGN) under an exit deal. It has not disclosed what proportion will go to CGN but a government spokesman said the payment "covers the value of their shareholding, their contribution to the project's development and a commercial return reflecting their work to date". "CGN has decided to exit the project at this stage in its development, following constructive commercial negotiations." Telegraph 29th Nov 2022
