CND is launching a <u>legal challenge</u> against both Suffolk County Council and the Secretary of State for Defence over the serious safety risks of siting US nukes at RAF Lakenheath.

Investigations by CND's legal team indicate that there are no emergency plans in place in the event of nuclear accidents involving these new US B61-12 bombs. This means the British government, without any public consultation or parliamentary debate, is making us all a target and putting us at risk from nuclear accidents without any emergency plans in place.

CND argues that if the UK government were to allow nuclear weapons to be stationed at Lakenheath without proper emergency plans, this could be in breach of statutory obligations which include a requirement to carry out a hazard evaluation and have plans prepared to limit the possibility of a radiation emergency, as well as a consequence assessment for if one should occur. If no such planning has taken place, on-site personnel, civilians and the environment will be in danger.

CND needs £6000 to cover the legal costs.

BITS FROM ABROAD

Donald Trump said that he wants to restart nuclear arms control talks with Russia and China and that eventually he hopes all three countries could agree to cut their massive defence budgets in half. Speaking to reporters in the Oval Office, Trump lamented the hundreds of billions of dollars being invested in rebuilding the nation's nuclear deterrent and said he hopes to gain commitments from the US adversaries to cut their own spending. "There's no reason for us to be building brandnew nuclear weapons. We already have so many," Trump said. "You could destroy the world 50 times over, 100 times over. You may have never heard of the National Nuclear Security Administration, but its work is crucial to your safety-and to that of every other human being on the planet. If Elon Musk's Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) hasn't yet come across the NNSA, it surely will before too long. What happens after that could be alarming. ... DOGE employees are bound to notice NNSA, an 1,800-person organization that sits inside the Department of Energy and burns through \$20 billion every year, much of it on classified work. But as they set out to discover exactly how the money is spent, they should proceed with care. Musk's incursions into other agencies have reportedly risked exposing sensitive information to ungualified personnel, and obstructing people's access to lifesaving medicine. According to several nuclear-security experts and a former senior department official, taking this same approach at the NNSA could make nuclear material at home and abroad less safe. The NNSA was created by Congress in 1999 in order to consolidate several Department of Energy functions under one bureaucratic roof: acquiring fissile material, manufacturing nuclear weapons, and preventing America's nuclear technology from leaking. It has all manner of sensitive information on hand, including nuclear-weapon designs and the blueprints for reactors that power Navy ships and submarines. Donald Trump has said he wants a "verified nuclear peace agreement" with Iran and denied he wanted to blow Iran to smithereens, describing such reports as "greatly exaggerated". But he said it was essential that Iran did not have a nuclear weapon, adding "we should start working on it immediately". CND Cymru warns against Starmer's 'antidemocratic' push for mini-nuclear reactors. The intention of this move by Starmer seems to be something that the nuclear power and weapons industry has only dreamt of before - the ability to ignore communities' wishes and focus their vast lobbying budgets on getting central government to allow them to build wherever they want, without opposition. Scottish Secretary Ian Murray has shocked campaigners after pledging to lobby his Government colleagues to get the UK to attend a key anti-nuclear summit. The government minister told anti-nuclear weapons campaigners in his Edinburgh South constituency he would lobby for Britain to attend a ban-the-bomb meeting in New York next month. In an email shared with The National, Murray said that the UK attending a meeting of countries signed up to the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW) would be a major boost for "global disarmament efforts". Murray said: "I believe that nuclear disarmament is not only a global public good of the highest order but also an essential step towards ensuring peace and security for all nations." A £4bn project to help replace nuclear-armed Trident submarines on the Clyde has been branded as "unachievable" for the third year running by a UK government watchdog. The Infrastructure and Projects Authority (IPA) has again given the manufacture of new reactors to power replacement submarines its lowest rating of "red" for 2023-24.. There are "major issues" that do not seem to be "manageable or resolvable", it said. The IPA has badged eight other major UK nuclear weapons projects, with a combined overall cost of over £55bn, as "amber". This means they are facing "significant issues" which require "management attention". These include building new facilities at the Faslane nuclear base, near Helensburgh, and dismantling nuclear submarines at Rosyth in Fife. The construction of the entire future nuclear-powered fleets of submarines -Astute, Dreadnought and Aukus - was also rated amber.

The Office for Nuclear Regulation has served an improvement notice on Sellafield Ltd following a shunting accident on the rail system at the Cumbria site. The enforcement action was taken after a railway wagon that hadn't been properly secured rolled about 60 metres along the track before colliding with a stationary wagon. The incident occurred during shunting activities when several other railway wagons were being moved on the same stretch of track.
