

Nuclear Weapons Spending in 2023

The nine nuclear-armed countries spent more than \$10 billion more on their nuclear arsenals last year than the year before, as ICAN shows in "[Surge: 2023 Global Nuclear Weapons Spending](#)". Between them, they pumped \$91.4 billion into the nuclear arms race, or \$2,898 per second.

The biggest spender, also with the largest one-year increase, is the United States, which spent \$51.5 billion, more than all other nuclear-armed countries combined. China expended \$11.9 billion and Russia spent the third largest amount at \$8.3 billion. The United Kingdom's spending increased significantly for the second year in a row, to \$8.1 billion.



The twenty corporations profiled in the report earned over \$30 billion for nuclear weapons related work in 2023, about a third of overall nuclear weapons spending. These companies have \$335 billion in contracts lined up, in some cases, until 2040 and spent more than \$123 million buying influence through lobbyists and think tank contributions.

Iran has further increased its stockpile of uranium enriched to near weapons-grade levels, according to a confidential report on Monday by the United Nations' nuclear watchdog, the latest in Tehran's attempts to steadily exert pressure on the international community.

As **Texas** wildfires burned toward the primary nuclear weapons facility, workers hurried to ensure nothing flammable was around buildings and storage areas. As the world's nations prepare for the 11th Nuclear Nonproliferation Treaty (NPT) conference to be held at the U.N. in New York in 2026, the prospects for proliferation should anchor their deliberations...There is a distinct possibility South Korea, Japan, the UAE, Egypt, Turkey, and Iran will all have nuclear weapons. After that, Algeria, Finland, Sweden, Ukraine, and Australia will be tempted to do the same. There could be more. What will drive this change? Several things: Increased Russian, Chinese, and North Korean nuclear threats, unrestrained forward basing of nuclear weapons beyond Russia's deployment to Belarus, waning allied confidence in the credibility of U.S. nuclear security guarantees, and an increasing acceptance of dangerous civilian nuclear activities that can bring states to the brink of bomb making.

Unite and GMB members have walked out after rejecting a revised offer from Nuclear Restoration Services (NRS) made earlier this month. Prospect union members accepted the deal after previously being involved in the dispute at the complex near Thurso. Unite and GMB are planning a further 24-hour strike on 19 June.

Sir Keir Starmer will pitch Labour as the “party of national security” as he seeks to switch attention to defence matters during the general election campaign. The Labour leader is expected to meet with forces veterans and a group of his party’s candidates when he campaigns in the North West. Sir Keir will reaffirm his commitment to a “nuclear deterrent triple lock” as well as his ambition to increase defence spending to 2.5 per cent of gross domestic product (GDP).

Anas Sarwar has defended Labour’s Trident “triple lock” ... Keir Starmer on Monday sparked fierce criticism from the SNP as he said Labour’s commitment to Trident was “absolute” and insisted he would press the nuclear button. This was questioned by First Minister John Swinney, who said “nobody’s going to use” nuclear weapons. Asked about the Labour leader’s comments, Sarwar said: “The world is a much more unsafe place than it was even a few years ago, never mind a decade or two decades ago, that’s why our commitment to Nato is resolute, our commitment to national security is resolute and not up for negotiation”.
